Jordans Picture House wins equipment award from the British Film Institute! Welcome to the April edition of the Jordans Village Newsletter. Having submitted a grant application in January, we were absolutely thrilled to receive the news last week that the BFI has awarded us the equipment we had requested, comprising a state of the art projector, amplifier, speakers and blackout blinds (total value c£5k).

As Jordans Picture House (JPH) had only been operating for a few months at that time and was not formally established as a Society or a Club, our application was underwritten by Jordans Village Ltd and we are very grateful for their support.


This was the final round of the BFI Neighbourhood Cinema Fund – backed by the National Lottery – and it was known to be heavily over-subscribed. Although we felt we had presented a very worthy case we could not be over-confident and it was more than a little worrying when the day scheduled for the announcement of results came and went...as did the next day, until finally late that afternoon the exciting news came through! This will save us travelling to Brighton and back for every screening to collect and return the hired equipment we have been using during our first season, and will significantly reduce the set-up and clear-up time for each performance.

Most importantly, thanks to a special wide-angle lens on the projector, we will be able to project the image higher and wider on our screen, taking full advantage of its size and giving improved visibility for those in the back rows of the audience.

We're really looking forward to setting this up and providing an even better experience for all our valued supporters next season (commencing in September) and beyond!



Jordans Village Community Store

I think that there is no point in beating about the bush - our wonderful village shop is rapidly getting towards an untenable situation when it will be forced to close.

Sales over the last fifteen months have been on a steady decline and despite fund raising efforts to prop it up the fact is that it is trading at a loss.

How would you feel about losing our village shop? It is the focal point of village life for many of us and a necessity for a number of our senior residents. The bottom line is of course that without a village shop the value of our houses would inevitably go down. Home owners I am sure you wouldn't be happy about that.

So what can we all do to stop this happening? There are about 245 households in Jordans and less than half use the shop on a regular basis. If all those of you who don't or rarely use it could spend just at least £5 a week or say £25 a month in it the difference to our financial stability would be considerable.

So what to buy? Well the shop has a wide range of every day household needs - many as cheap if not cheaper than local supermarkets. Loo paper, kitchen paper, dish washing liquid - the list is endless. Why not put in a monthly order and all this bulky stuff will be delivered? Deliveries go out every Friday.

The chillers are stocked with fresh locally sourced meat including excellent pork sausages and fish caught just the previous day is brought up from Cornwall fortnightly. See the fish sign up on top of the boards in front of the shop for when it has arrived. Cheese yogurts and of course milk - are always there.

The comparatively new upright freezer has everything you could want for an instant meal including vegetarian options. Chicken Kievs, meat pies pizzas and for desert cheesecakes and apple pies.

Bread is delivered from Strattons the Chalfont St Giles bakery daily during the week and artisan bakers Rex in Little Chalfont who bake on Saturdays and Sundays bring sourdough and other interesting loaves as well as delicious croissants, giant pain-au-chocolat and pain au raisin at the weekends. Not very hard to spend £5 a week! Please support our enthusiastic and totally committed manager Emma, a villager herself, who is always prepared to source whatever a customer would like - and the very helpful staff - and volunteers - and keep Jordans Village Community Store alive and an integral part of the village.



Our final film for this first season was the thoroughly enjoyable story of Eddie "the Eagle" Edwards, the hapless British Olympic ski-jumper who battled against all the odds and every obstacle that was put in his way, eventually to achieve his dream at the 1988 Calgary Winter Olympics.

Based on real-life events, it was full of humour, breathtaking scenery and equally breathtaking views from the scary heights of the 70m and 90m ski-jump slopes, whilst all the time delivering a strong message about determination and never giving up.

Before the performance Julie Coldicott (our theming and décor specialist) had thanked all those who have supported us and she paid tribute to our leader Alan Sealy, whose energy has driven us all along. Lorraine Bristow then presented a donation of £100 to the Manager of Slough Food Bank, with which we and the Village Shop have formed a supportive relationship following our earlier screening of the very moving film "I, Daniel Blake".

In closing, Chris Waymouth summed up our success with the fact that 8 of our 10 screenings had been sell-outs with an overall total of 458 attendances including a number of very loyal

supporters who had been to just about every film; he also briefly outlined some of the plans for next season which will hopefully include the establishment of a website with our programme and an online booking system, our formation as a proper Society, and – a mere fingers-crossed hope at that stage – possibly the acquisition of our own projection and sound equipment. A hope that has now become a happy reality!

Everyone went away happy (possibly aided by the complimentary glass of gluhwein!) and in agreement that it was a very entertaining film and a great way to end the season, quite literally on a high.

Very many thanks to all who have made this venture the success that it has become.



Organising the Future of Jordans Village Hall


As membership of the Jordans Village Hall Trust grows, we wanted to explain its role in more detail as well as how it fits into the organisation of Jordans.

Jordans Village Hall Trust (JVHT) is a charitable organisation (#1168253) established on 18th July 2016 to renew and then manage the village hall. Charitable status gives significant advantages. Most grant-giving organisations give only to other charities and as a charity we can also reclaim Gift Aid and benefit from some VAT savings. JVHT is legally independent of Jordans Village Ltd (JVL), who own the current village hall and land, but will be granted a lease on the site once a significant amount of the necessary fundraising has been achieved, and approval to their plans is given by JVL. This will enable JVHT to either carry out considerable renovation and extension work or demolish and build a new village hall. We are currently in the feasibility stage, investigating the options for both renovation and rebuilding, and plan to share those results at a public meeting in the coming months.

There are currently nine Trustees on the JVHT Board, all local residents. Three of these trustees are nominated by Jordans Village Ltd's Management Committee. The maximum number of trustees is ten and elections will be held every 3 years. 



Thames Valley Dowsers

AN INTRODUCTION TO DOWSING AND LEARN TO DOWSE FOR FREE!Can I dowse? Yes, certainly, with good tuition and practice anyone can become a dowser anditisgreatfuntolearn.

What is Dowsing? Dowsing is a way of finding out about things we cannot see. It is a wonderful tool and one we can all use. You may well have heard of dowsing or "divining" being used to find water. Dowsing is also used in the surveying of building and archaeological searches; in looking for oil, mineral deposits and lost objects and for the investigation of earth energies and geopathic stress. Health practitioners use dowsing to indicate the nature of illness, allergies and intolerances and required remedies.

Dowsers use simple dowsing tools -L Rod, Y rod, pendulum and wand to help them find what they are seeking. The tool responds to the different energies and vibrations within people, objects and the environment changing its position to reveal what is hidden and to provide answers to specific questions.

The Thames Valley Dowsing Group is a special interest group affiliated to the British Society of Dowsers and has a membership currently of about 42 people within the Thames Valley Area. Monthly events are organised at their venue the Jordans Quaker Centre, Welders Lane, Jordans, Nr. Beaconsfield, Bucks, HP9 2 SN, being either talks on dowsing or a related subject, or a field trip to explore the earth energies at a sacred site. You don't have to be a dowser or a member to come to our talks. Membership is £15 per annum July to June and non- members are welcome at our events.

Learn to Dowse for FREE! Saturday 6th May, starting at 2 p.m.- 5 pm. At Jordans Quaker Meeting House and grounds. We will be teaching dowsing with rods outside looking for water and energy lines followed by pendulum dowsing inside with practical exercises. We will supply rods and pendulums.
