



## Jordans Biodiversity Project Wildlife Monitoring on Manor Farm Field North

Do you know a skipper from a hairstreak? Or a scabious from a saxifrage? As we move into the summer months, we will start to monitor the birds, butterflies and plants on Manor Farm Field to build a baseline understanding of the existing wildlife. We're looking for some volunteers to help us to do this.

What it will involve:

*Butterfly monitoring* – we will be visiting the field once a month April to September, which will take about an hour and always in fine weather;

*Plant monitoring* – monthly from May to July which will take about 1.5 hours each time;

*Bird monitoring* – two outings between April and August to look and listen for birds. We will be using the scientific survey methods of the national monitoring schemes to build our own datasets as well as contribute to the national surveys.

## <u>Help keep the drains in Jordans clear!</u>

Over the last year or so, several drains around the Estate have overflowed on an increasing number of occasions. The drains behind the houses facing Jordans Lane, starting from the corner with Seer Green Lane; the drain on the verge in Copse Lane that serves the terrace on Green West Road to the right of the Store; and the drain right behind the back of the Village Hall next to the footpath that serves the houses facing Copse Lane are the three worst affected. Several times, raw sewage has overflowed which is highly unpleasant for the residents who have been affected by it.

Each time the cause is the same - people flushing wipes down the toilet. No matter what wet wipe manufacturers or packaging say, wipes must NOT be flushed away. They <u>must</u> be bagged and thrown away with your general waste.

The drains in Jordans are old, made of clay, and laid many decades ago not long after the village was founded. Over time, the clay can crack due to ground movements, traffic, or roots. Around 40 or 50 years ago, plastic liners were pushed down inside them, which reduced their internal diameter and they've far more susceptible to blockages by wipes which, unlike paper do not dissolve in water when flushed.

PLEASE educate your families and stop flushing wipes away! It's really horrible for those who suffer the effect downstream. Here is some advice from Thames Water on this country wide problem, as well as various other things which should never be flushed down the toilet, or your kitchen sinks. .

### Working together to prevent blockages

We clear around 75,000 blockages from our sewers each year. Many of these are caused by items like wet wipes, sanitary items and cotton pads that can't break down. When they're flushed down the loo, they combine with cooking fats and oils, eventually blocking pipes. This can force raw sewage back up drains, plugholes, and toilets and into homes.

We've put together some handy tips on how to prevent blocked pipes around your home.

#### In your bathroom

#### Bin the nasties

Wipes, condoms, sanitary products, cotton wool, and dental floss are some of the biggest offenders in our sewers. Throw them in the bin, not the loo. The three Ps is the best rule to remember when it comes to what's flushable; pee, poo, paper. Nothing else!

#### Switch it up

There are loads of alternatives to wet wipes and sanitary products on the market now. Why not try a few? You'll be helping the planet in more ways than one.

#### Myth: 'Flushable' products are safe to put in the loo

Many companies market products as 'flushable'. But these wipes contain plastic, so they won't break down the same way as toilet paper does. Although they'll disappear when you flush, they won't completely leave your drains. Pop them in the bin to be safe.

#### In your kitchen

#### Lovely leftovers

Resist the temptation to tip old food down the kitchen sink and be sure to scrape it in the bin. If it's more of a 'liquid' food like gravy, use some kitchen roll or newspaper to soak it up, then put it in the bin.

#### Fat, oil and grease

Cooking fat and oils will eventually turn solid and build up in your pipes. Instead of pouring them down the sink, collect them in a container like a jam jar or yoghurt pot. Leave them to cool, and once they've set, scoop them out and pop them straight in the bin.

Your local council may also have a special way to dispose of fat, oil and grease – check with them if you'd like to find out more.

*Myth: Hot water and soap will break down oils and fats, keeping the pipe clear* If you've blocked your drain, crossed fingers and a squirt of washing-up liquid won't clear it. That's because hot water and soap don't dissolve oils and fats. The soap may actually harden in your pipes, sticking to other items and adding to the problem.

#### What we're doing

On average, we clear around 200 blockages each day from homes across our region. 60% of sewer flooding in homes is caused by blockages. Our ongoing mission is to raise awareness of this issue to help you prevent blockages and sewer flooding at home.

#### Working with wet wipe manufacturers

We know from experience that the term 'flushable' isn't accurate where sewers are

concerned.

In fact, items labelled 'flushable' are made with plastic. This means they can take hundreds of years to properly break down and can still clog up your pipes.

We're working to influence manufacturers to remove the plastics in the wipes. This will not only help to protect your pipes, but also help to protect the planet, too!
