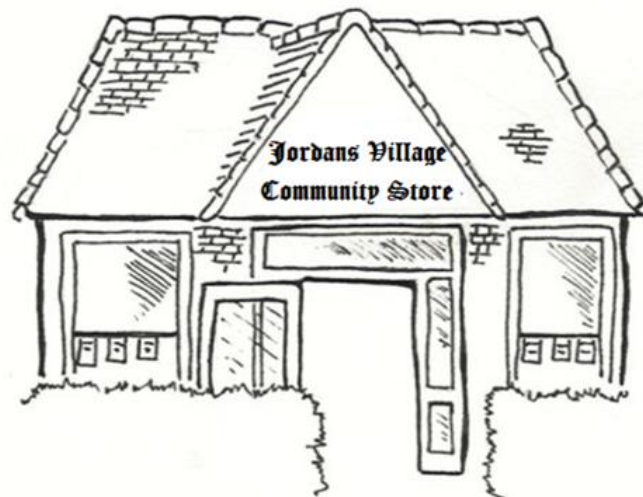

About the Village Store

Jordans Village Community Store, founded in 1922, is an independent community store, owned, operated and controlled by the Village. It is run by a combination of part-time staff and volunteers from the local community.

It started in a very small way in the front room of one of the early workers' cottages by the Village Green. In 1921, the brick building, now used as the Estate Office, was erected and a proper store opened.

The store is now a general grocers, with green groceries, an off-licence, a sub post office and café. It caters for online orders, and home delivery. We care about where our food comes from and how it is packaged, for example bread is baked for us at local bakeries in Chalfont St Giles and Little Chalfont; our milk is directly from a herd in Staffordshire; vegetables are via Blackwells - who pride themselves on locating the freshest fruit and vegetables and not covering them in plastic!

The Store also serves as a natural meeting place for many of those living around the village, so why not come in and receive a warm welcome from our friendly staff and team of volunteers who are all eager to help you. www.jordansvillagestore.co.uk/

Local Plan Consultation

The "Chiltern & South Bucks Local Plan 2036" sets out how the Council will achieve enough housing for a theoretical calculated increase in population by 2036. This means ignoring the many policies and scientific advice covering the protection of Green Belt land and wildlife habitats, in order to meet an arbitrary number that may or may not ever happen. The Plan includes a proposal to remove Jordans Village from Green Belt designation, as shown on the map below.

It is very important that local residents respond and write to their MP and Councillors to let them know their views on this Local Plan! In summary:

The proposal to remove the Green Belt designation from Jordans is unsound because:

- It does not comply with national policy:
- the required consultation with the local community has not been carried out
- it conflicts with the recently approved Neighbourhood Plan for Chalfont St Giles, which has been ignored
- the exceptional circumstances required to justify the alteration of Green Belt boundaries have not been demonstrated
- other policy options for achieving the desired outcome in Jordans have not been examined
- This proposal is not justified because it is based on an inaccurate assessment of the character of the village and its openness, and because the boundaries proposed for the Green Belt around Jordans do not meet the standards set by the government and Chiltern District Council.

As a result it is recommended that Jordans should be removed from the list of villages under Policy SP PP1 of the draft Local Plan, and added to the list of villages under Policy DM PP1.

How to respond to the consultation

There are several ways in which to respond to the consultation.

The deadline to reply is 23rd August 2019.

The best way is to go online and complete the response form. It has been made deliberately long to fill in (34 pages!), but there is a relatively simple way to fill it in:

1. [Download our Response Letter by clicking here and save it to your device](#)
2. Go to the [Local Plan Consultation portal by clicking here](#)
3. Within the section "Chiltern & South Bucks Local Plan 2036, either Login or Register so that you can respond
4. Once logged in, within the section "Chiltern & South Bucks Local Plan 2036, click the button "Go To Plan"
5. Go to Section 10.2 of the Consultation entitled "Protected - Green Belt" which details Policy SP PP1 referencing Jordans
6. To the right of this Section, click on the Blue Speech Balloon with a + symbol within it to add your comments (you can just write "see attached letter") & also **ensure that you attach our Response Letter** from wherever you saved it on your device in step 1.

7. Submit your response once you have added comments to any other section as you see fit

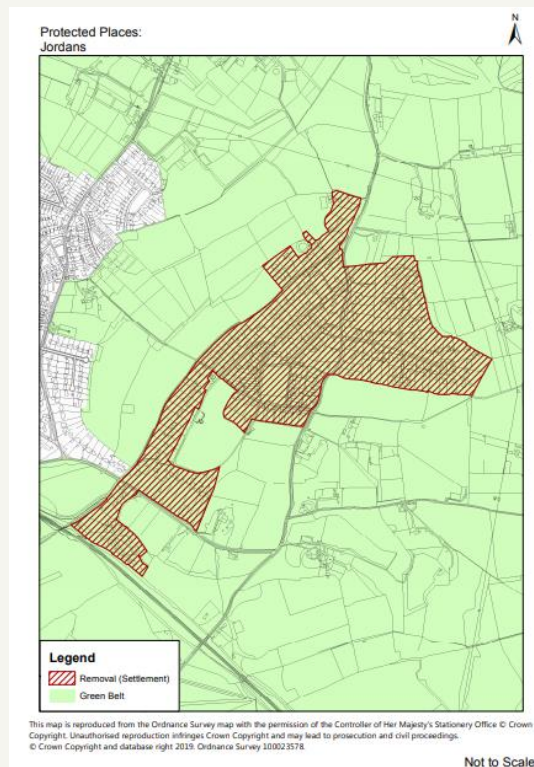

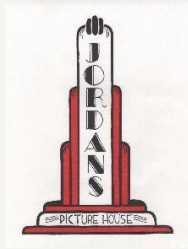

Traffic Flow around Jordans Village

During school term time, traffic flow around the village peaks at morning drop-off time (8:30am - 9:15am) and in the afternoon when pupils are collected (2:45pm - 3:15pm).

As our roads are quite narrow, and because this additional traffic is entirely predictable, it would greatly assist the flow of traffic if residents living on the roads listed below can follow the same direction of flow as school parents have been asked to follow.

Although not a hard and fast rule, it would be helpful if you can please drive around the village in a clockwise direction during the drop-off and collection times. That is to exit the village via Puers Field, Crutches Lane, and Green East Road, and arrive in the village via Seer Green Lane, Green West Road, and Puers Lane, as shown on the diagram above.

If possible, please also ask any contractors or delivery drivers visiting your home during these hours to follow the same clockwise direction.

Neighbourhood Watch in Jordans

Improve our Security - Free

Did you know that people who live in roads covered by active Neighbourhood Watch (NhW) schemes are around eight times less likely to suffer a burglary?

Most homes in Jordans are not covered by active schemes these days, so we are working to rectify this – ultimately hoping to cover the entire village. You can get the added protection of Neighbourhood Watch right away. It is easy and it costs nothing. Simply go to ourwatch.org.uk and click 'Join' on the right-hand panel.

Neighbourhood Watch is the UK's largest crime-reduction scheme, with 2.3 million households covered. It is run by volunteers keen to help their local community, both by deterring crime locally and caring for the general well-being of their neighbours.

Neighbourhood Watch schemes are geographically-based, usually covering a road or part of one, but working alongside other local schemes to maximise coverage. They are run by volunteer Coordinators who gather the views and concerns of their community and communicate these to the relevant authority. Members get security advice and crime Alerts directly from the police by email – and it's all completely free. Other benefits include a probable discount to household insurance costs.

Paws for Thought

Toxic Foods For Dogs To Avoid

This month I am addressing some of the foods that are poisonous to dogs. Each year hundreds of dogs and puppies are accidentally poisoned in their own homes. This most commonly happens when a dog ingests something with an appealing taste or smell such as chocolate!

With most foods the danger is determined by the individual dog and quantity consumed. Some dogs can tolerate certain foods whereas others might suffer serious side effects. Marty, for example, the black and white Tibetan Terrier I looked after for 14 years (who died recently) was an artful opportunist. Whilst at home with his owners Marty ate a whole box of dark chocolate liquors, but amazingly suffered only a mild stomach upset. Most dog owners are aware of the fact that **chocolate** is a definite no, no, for dogs and the higher the cocoa content the higher the risk. Chocolate used for baking or dark chocolate is more dangerous than milk chocolate. A 3 ounce chunk of dark chocolate is enough to be fatal to a 25-pound dog.

Coffee and coffee grounds also pose a threat to dogs since the toxicity in caffeine is similar to that of chocolate. Both can cause vomiting, stomach upset, hyperactivity, tremors, seizures, and coma.

Dogs can also suffer from **alcoholic poisoning**. If drinks are left around on the floor after a party for instance, your dog may well drink what is left in them. The side effects of this consumption could be clumsiness, tremors, nervous system problems, stomach upset and coma.

Below is a list of 10 of the more likely foods your dog may have access to and the dangers they pose.

- **High Fat Foods:** Bacon fat, turkey and chicken skin, steak trimmings, and other high fat foods such as gravy. These can cause pancreatitis, which is potentially fatal. The effects can be cumulative or from just one feeding.
- **Mouldy Food:** Mouldy food found in dustbins can contain mycotoxins, which if consumed could cause central nervous disorders, tremors, and acute vomiting. They can also harbour salmonella.
- **Xylitol (a sugar substitute):** Baked goods, sweets, mints, and chewing gum often contain xylitol. If dogs ingest this they may experience a sudden drop in blood sugar, which could cause seizures, depression and a loss of co-ordination.
- **Grapes and Raisins:** These can be highly dangerous to dogs, although it is yet to be discovered why. Consumption can cause kidney failure, abdominal pain and vomiting.
- **Avocado;** The flesh, stones (stones also pose a choking hazard) and skin of avocado contain a toxin called Persin. This can cause upset stomach, vomiting and laboured breathing.
- **Fruit Seeds and Pips:** Apples, apricots, cherries, peaches and similar fruits contain cyanide in their seeds, pips, stems and leaves. These can cause varying degrees of illness if consumed in moderate to large quantities, but the actual fruit flesh poses no risk. However, the peel, fruit and seeds of citrus fruits contain citric acid, limonin, and volatile oils. These can cause gastrointestinal upset and vomiting if consumed in large quantities.
- **Onions:** Onions when broken down in a dogs digestive system can cause damage to their red blood cells. This can cause them to have anaemia and even require a blood transfusion. Large quantities of garlic and chives can cause the same side effects.
- **Macadamia Nuts:** Even a small amount of these nuts if eaten can cause vomiting, tremors, depression and the temporary paralysis of the hind legs.
- **Yeast Dough:** Uncooked yeast dough can literally rise in a dog's stomach causing a blockage in the digestive tract. In addition to this the alcohol produced during fermentation can cause alcoholic poisoning.
- **Salt:** Foods containing large quantities of salt can produce sodium poisoning. This can result in excessive thirst, tremors, seizures, vomiting, and upset stomach.
