## Manor Farm Fields Biodiversity Project


On Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July an open meeting was held in the Village Hall to discuss promoting biodiversity in Manor Farm Fields. The Biodiversity Group shared their management plan and conservation expert John Shaw, from the Chiltern Rangers, discussed why projects like this are vital to support our native plants, insects and other animals in the climate emergency, as well as how the Chiltern Rangers can support Jordans to deliver the new plan. The meeting was well attended and the questions after fully addressed the range of interests and concerns around the project.



## Jordans Village Limited Should JVL become a charity?

This is the question that the Management Committee (MC) asked itself during its annual Awayday on Sunday 31 July. The Awayday is the time when the MC's members can discuss important matters in more depth than is possible during the regular monthly meetings.

The question had been prompted during JVL's contacts with Bournville Village Trust, which is a charity and is similar in its background to Jordans. The MC believed it should examine the question to see whether a change of status (it is now a Community Benefit Society) would benefit the village. John Bell as Treasurer carried out some detailed research into the question, which he presented at the Awayday. This showed that if JVL becomes a charity, it would not have to pay Corporation Tax, which would be worth around £15,000 per year, which could be reinvested in JVL's properties. But the research also showed that JVL would have to focus its rented properties on people in need in order to qualify as a charity. It would have to become a Registered Social Landlord, which would require JVL to make substantial changes to its waiting list policy. Its property rents would become subject to government formulae and controls, and JVL would have to provide reports on its performance to government. So the MC concluded unanimously that becoming a charity is **not** appropriate.

The MC also discussed JVL's Planning Policy following the village consultation earlier this year, and the new policy will be made available on JVL's website during August for residents' comments.

Taking on board feedback received from some residents, we considered how we can improve the efficiency of the Committee structures and how we approach proposals which would have a significant impact on the village. We also examined the Climate Action Plan, and the Waiting List policy (we expect to consult the village on this policy towards the end of this year). We covered a lot of ground!

**Loving Earth Project Exhibition at the Meeting House (June 20 – July 17):** Over the four weeks we had over 300 visitors, including many from Jordans.
