Manor Farm Fields Event - Creating Seed Beds and Fence Fixing

Come and get involved!

Saturday 12th August 10am - 1pm

We're delighted to announce our first conservation event in MFF. Please share your skills and time to help create seed beds - in the autumn we will be sowing these with wildflower mixes to help kickstart the variety of plants in the field. We will also be fixing the fence on the western boundary to make sure it is stock proof for when the cows come back in.

This event includes heavy work scraping the ground with mattocks and driving in fence posts but there are lighter tasks too. Because of the equipment being used, children must be supervised by their accompanying adults at all times. No dogs in the field please. Please wear long trousers, sturdy footwear and work/gardening gloves.

Please meet at the top of Dangerous Descent at 10am or drop in to Manor Farm Field later. Refreshments provided, please bring your own mug.

There are a number of butterfly species making the most of the bramble flowers in the hedges around MFF. We've spotted Speckled Woods, Meadow Browns, Green-veined Whites,

Marbled Whites, Commas, Skippers, Small Coppers and others. Changes to the plant biodiversity of the field will mean more habitats and food sources for these butterflies and other less common species so we would hope to see more of them in future years (plus more of the animals that feed on them too).

The Jolly Quaker is taking a break in August!





Sam Lomas 5th February 1964 - 4th June 2023

Sam Lomas was born at 12 The Green, 3rd of 4 children to John and Tessa Lomas. Although he was born and died in Jordans, Sam had also lived in Australia, Cyprus and Athens. Sam often told me stories of his childhood, roaming the woods and surrounding countryside with his band of "brothers" all around the same age and all of whom have remained important in each others' lives.

Sam's extraordinary talent as an artist was evident from a young age and he went on to develop a unique style without the benefit of a fine art training. It wasn't until he was in his thirties, married with two young children, that Sam went to college, where he studied Design and Advertising, imbuing his work with his sharp, life-on-the-edge sense of humour. In 2011, Sam decided to devote his time to his art, building a studio in the garden of Long Redding a couple of years later - a far cry from his "studio" in the loft at 16 Puers Field flats.

Sam was a great observer, absorbing information, colour, line, form, style from any and every source. He would sit for hours, seemingly lost in contemplation of the view, watching documentaries, listening to music, making notes, surfing the 'net. All of this showed up in his paintings, as he learnt his craft from such greats as Schiele, Klimt, Picasso, Mondrian and Kandinsky as well as from African art and his memories of scuba-diving in the Solomon Islands. Every visit to a gallery all over the world, every holiday he took, resulted in a development in his painting.

Sam was an explorer, a listener, a dancer, a wit and a loyal friend.

He loved and was loved.

<u>Christopher John Castles</u> November 9th 1949 to March 11th 2023

Chris was the only child of Alfred and Marjorie Castles. When Chris was a young child he moved from Kent to Jordans to live at the Youth Hostel where his mother was warden. Chris attended the primary school in Jordans.

He was very interested in engineering and trained to be a tool maker. He emigrated to British Columbia as a young man and worked as a technician in the University of British Columbia in Vancouver.

He had many interests including competitive motorcycling. He was in both the British and Canadian Enduro racing teams and picked up a number of broken bones while riding. Chris was a keen flyer and owned a small plane. He was also an accomplished guitar player.

When he retired he moved to Vernon BC but spent a number of years back in Jordans at Puers Field where he cared for his very infirm mother. Following her death Chris returned permanently to Vernon where he spent much time during winter and spring skiing on the local slopes.

Chris was skiing in March this year when he suffered a fatal heart attack. Chris had never married and had no children.
