

## **Speaker's Corner**

After the presentation on the Future of the Village Hall on 6th October, we received a huge response to the survey from our residents. Nearly two thirds of those who responded were in support of building a new Village Hall (64%), more than double the amount in support of renovation (29%). 6% were undecided, and 1% were in favour of keeping the hall as it is.

We didn't ask only for your opinion on which direction we should take, but we also received

a huge amount of very constructive comments and feedback about the design, for which we are extremely grateful. We also asked you for your ideas for events, facilities, and activities that you'd like to see at our Village Hall. Every single response has been read, reviewed, and collated; the results are presented below.

The overwhelming message about the design concept we presented (no matter which option was supported) was that it was too big. Based on this feedback, the JVL Management Committee has instructed the Village Hall Sub-Commto revise the design and to prepare a Strategic Plan for the construction of a new Village Hall, including the next steps we need to take, and how the village should be involved and how it should be consulted in the decision making process.

The response to the Survey generated many offers of skills and assistance with the project, some of which will be of use at the beginning of the project, others towards the end. In order to formulate the strategic plan the Village Hall Committee will expand with additional members to handle the formidable, but eminently achievable task ahead. We will reach out to those who have so generously offered their skills in the specific areas that will be of immediate use to the committee as it takes its next steps.

Thanks again to everyone for taking part, and may I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year!



We are lucky here in so many ways, not least in the depth of musical talent, and the well-attended concert in the village hall on Sunday afternoon 15 November presented by Bob Hall reflected this. Space precludes me from mentioning everyone who took part, so my main focus will unashamedly be on the Jordans residents!

Andy Nice has a fine repertoire of new and exciting cello pieces, and his performance of "Broadway" by the American composer Aaron Minsky was no exception. I note that Minsky's "celtar" style (which combines cello and guitar technique) has entered both the

Wilton Park Public Consultation Inland Homes would like to invite you to a public consultation on the redevelopment of Wilton Park, which popular and classical worlds- and Andy clearly enjoyed playing it.

Esther Cavett and Eleanor Bartlett on piano and violin respectively then gave us the first movement of the Dvorak Sonatina. He wrote this fresh and joyful work for his clearly talented children. Esther followed this with the first three Beethoven Bagatelles Op 119; these are intriguing to watch as well as to hear, as the second in particular required her dextrously to cross her hands on the keyboard.

Eleanor returned to the platform to join Esther in the first movement of the Brahms Sonata in D minor; the third of its genre, it is a work of extreme concision and drama, contrasting starkly with the other two sonatas.

Bob Hall, the piano and Beethoven run together in local music circles, and this concert was no exception. He gave us the Adagio for the composer's Piano Sonata no 3, Op 2. Bob mentioned that the middle section contains numerous examples of Romanticism, and is considered a prelude to the master's later sonatas. However, it is a wonderful piece in itself.

Seer Green was ably represented by that talented father and son duo Julian and Raphael Darley (10) who gave a spirited performance of the Violin Duo in G by Jacques Fereol Mazas, which Raphael introduced.

The Dvorak Slavonic Dances no 7 and 8 finished the afternoon's music, played with formidable gusto and spirit by Bob Hall and Graham Hine. The latter piece in particular highlighted the composer's inate gift of melody, surely rivalled only by Schubert.

Jordans Quaker Meeting House, built in 1688, is one of the earliest purpose-built Quaker Meeting Houses in England. Meeting for Worship had been held here for more than 300 years until a serious fire in March 2005 caused extensive damage.

The Meeting House reopened in August 2008. After the fire, Chilterns Area Meeting Friends conceived of, and raised funds for, a new, larger extension behind the restored Meeting House which offers a range of rooms available for hire and to house exhibitions and non-residential events of all kinds.
