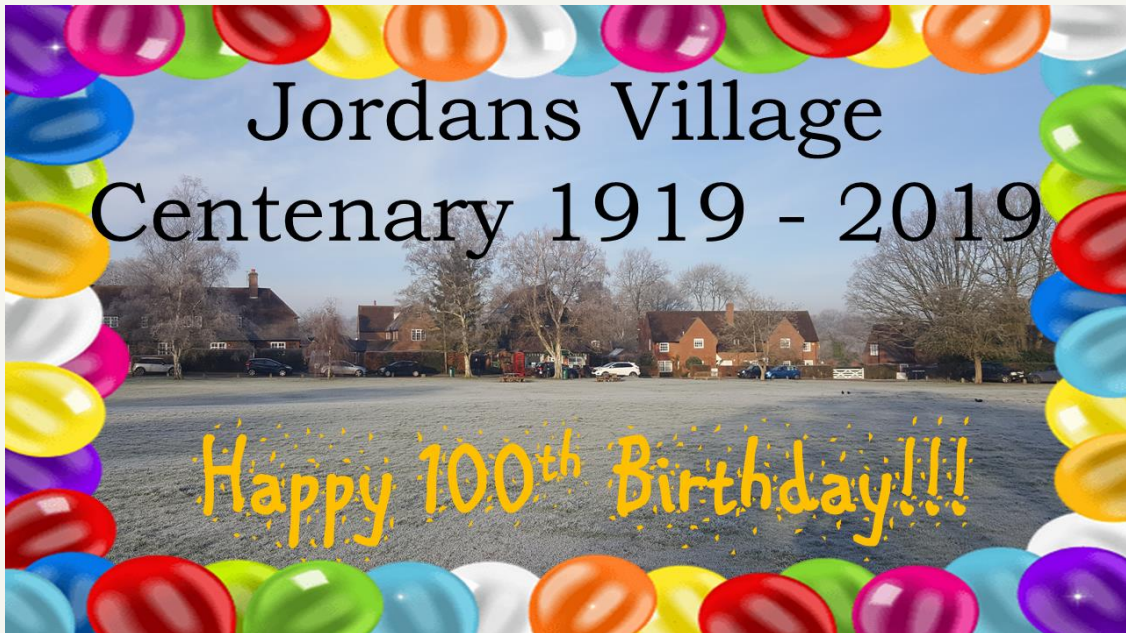

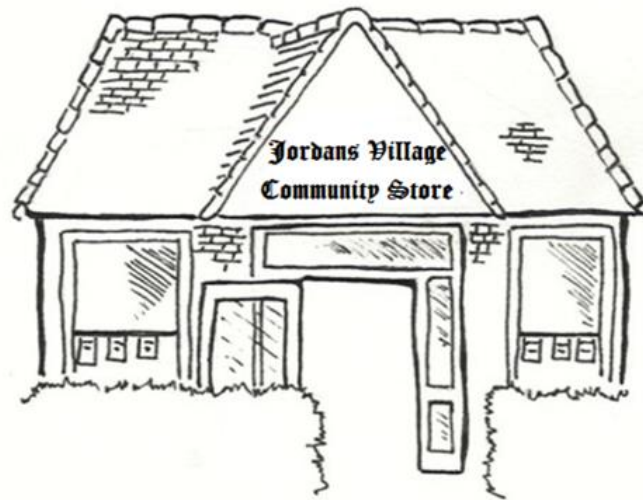

It started in a very small way in the front room of one of the early workers' cottages by the Village Green. In 1921, the brick building, now used as the Estate Office, was erected and a proper store opened.

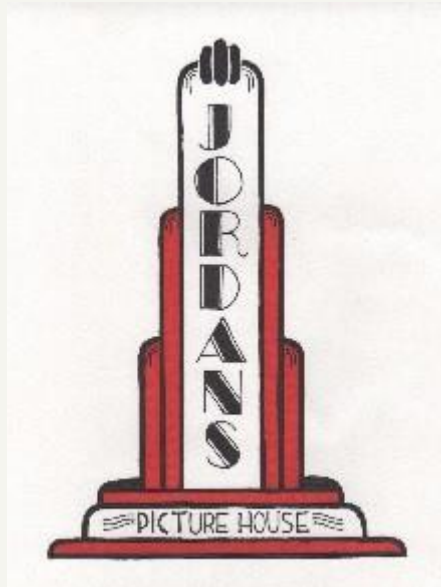

Paws for Thought

Things for dog owners to consider during the cold winter months

With the colder weather upon us it is important that dog owners remember that in exceptionally cold weather dogs should not be left in the car or tied up outside. If you are going shopping, out to lunch, or to an event, it is advisable to leave your dog at home.

Prolonged exposure to the cold can result in your dog getting hypothermia, the first sign of which is shivering. Shivering helps a dog to retain its body heat by increasing its metabolism. A dog that is shivering should be brought inside and dried off if necessary, and then covered with a blanket or towel.

It is also worth remembering that dogs can get dehydrated in cold weather because there is less humidity in the air. It is therefore important to make sure there is access to clean drinking water at all times. However, don't give your dog ice cold water to drink as it will reduce its body temperature further.

The salt and grit that is used on roads and pavements is hard on paws. Paws can however be protected by rubbing a small amount of Vaseline into the pads, or one of the lick-safe balms available online or from pet shops.

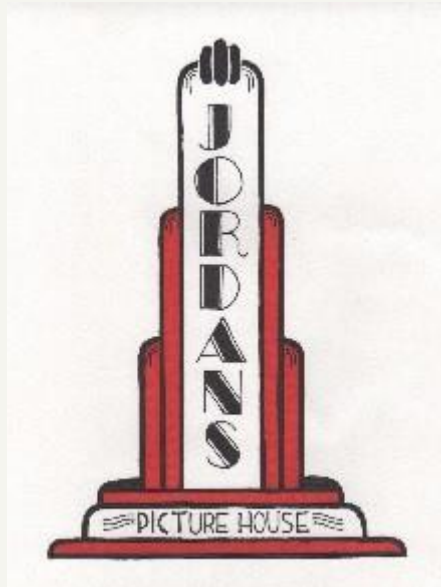
In addition to this Antifreeze containing Ethylene (EG) is poisonous to dogs. Antifreeze can drip down from cars so be mindful of this and wash any spillages away. However, Antifreeze containing Propylene Glycol is pet-safe. When possible avoid walking with your dog on roads and pavements that have been treated. To lessen the risk of your dog ingesting any poison it is advisable that on returning home you wash or wipe your dog's paws with a warm damp cloth.

Good grooming is also essential for healthy winter paws. With long haired dogs one can lessen the chance of snow balls forming on paws by trimming the fur around their pads.

Lastly, healthy dogs still need to get out for a walk during cold and snowy weather. However, two short walks rather than one long walk are worth considering.
