

Jordans Village Store celebrates its 100th Birthday! 100 YEARS AT THE HEART OF OUR COMMUNITY

It is with enormous pleasure and great excitement that we, the Jordans Village Community Store Committee, launch the celebrations for the CENTENARY OF OUR VILLAGE SHOP!

100 years ago this year, as Jordans was literally rising from the ground and self-sufficiency was still a tough order in an area of uncultivated fields and relatively few animals, the embryonic idea of a commercial business in the form of a village shop was conceived.

Moving from a worker's cottage to the (now) Estate Office building, and subsequently to its current site right in front of the newly built Village Hall and overlooking what was to become the Village Green, right from the outset our shop made its presence felt.

JORDANS VILLAGE COMMUNITY STORE with its position right in the centre of our village rapidly took on its role as the 'heart' of our village. Despite the invasion of supermarkets over the last 40 years creeping closer and closer to Jordans this heart is still beating strongly after 100 years.

It is an achievement that few local villages can claim, it is an achievement made possible by you our villagers, it is an achievement to celebrate.



Jordans supports the Great Little Chalfont Refugee Welcome

The Great Little Chalfont Refugee Welcome is a community group supported by the Government's Community Sponsorship <u>scheme</u> in which communities work with the Government to bring a refugee family from a camp or conflict zone directly to the UK.

The community then supports the family with a rented home and medical, social and educational expertise - and surrounds them with friendship as they rebuild their lives. In this way, they come with their status assured and with a community in place to welcome them and help them integrate.

In March, the Chalfonts community will be welcoming a family of six who were forced to flee their home in Syria. They are currently living in Jordan (not Jordans!). There's a Mum, Dad and four children, ages 3-12. The family were selected by the Home Office and the United Nations based on a set of strict criteria. They are not able to return to Syria and it is not sustainable for them to continue living in Jordan.

A home has been found nearby and our aim is to furnish it during the next two months and make our new neighbours feel safe, welcome and at home here.

If you prefer to donate funds, you may do so through the Great Little Chalfont Refugee Welcome "Just Giving" page. The GLCRW is not a registered charity, but is working with a registered charity called <u>Citizens UK</u> through a Memorandum of Understanding signed by both parties. Citizens UK have worked with almost 100 community sponsorship groups to resettle refugee families. They act as the guarantor for the family if the community group were ever unable to provide what they require.

JORDANS VILLAGE PERFORMS: soothing group musical meditation — all welcome!

As part of the Jordans Village Performs programme of community music events, we invite *all players or aspiring players* from the complete novice to the experienced performer, of *any* style of music and *any* instrument to take place in a <u>musical</u> "event" taking place in Jordans Village Hall from 5.30 to 7.00 on Sunday, 20th February. The only thing asked of those attending is a willingness to LISTEN to others taking part! Audience welcome.

The piece to be performed is called *Many Hands*. *Many Hands* is a flexible piece for any combination of instruments, consisting of several "movements" or sections, each of which draws on a specific emotion (rasa) traditionally expressed in Indian raga. We encourage you to bring your own beverage (tea, coffee, G&T, etc) to sustain you during the event.

The event will be led by composer Janet Davey. Jan has worked extensively within the community, including 12 years for Little Missenden Festival, for massed musicians and children at the Royal Albert Hall, in schools, and with the elderly. Many Hands has been performed widely and broadcast on BBC Radio 3.






Planning Policy Consultation



Paws for Thought An Anxious Dog's Tale

Now that Covid seems to be abating, and people are returning to their offices, there should be less demand for puppies, so dog theft will hopefully become less of a threat.

However, one still needs to be vigilant. Whilst shopping in Beaconsfield high street

recently, I was concerned when two ladies tied their Irish Terrier to the railings opposite M&S, and then proceeded to go into the shop. I wondered why one of them had not stayed with the dog. Being concerned for its welfare, I felt that I could not go home until I saw the owners return. The dog looked agitated from the start and was staring intently at the doors of M&S. I asked myself, 'what are you doing' and 'is this really necessary?' However, I decided that for my own peace of mind I had to keep an eye on the dog until the ladies returned.

I decided to approach the dog and put my hand out to it, but it seemed even more worried by my presence (who could blame it?), so I just observed it (not sure of its gender) from Whistles shop front window. A shop assistant asked if she could help me. I told her I was just monitoring a dog that was tied to the railings. She immediately sympathised and said she would never leave her dog tied up outside a shop and understood my concern!

Thankfully after about 15 minutes the two women emerged. The dog was very pleased to see them, frantically wagging its tail, and going from one to the other. I was relieved that they had returned, and that the dog was reunited with them.

The RSPCA strongly advises against leaving your dog tied up outside a shop or leaving it alone in the car.

Surprisingly some dog owners are not aware of the fact that it is a legal requirement to have your dog microchipped, and for it to have up to date details on its collar, or a disc, which should include a phone number. However, it is better not to give your dog's name, as this would make it easier for potential thieves to lure the dog away.

Thankfully dog abduction is now a criminal offence, and this should serve as a greater deterrent to those committing the crimes. In the Government's 'Kept Animal Bill' the dog abduction offence announced in November 2021 will be added to it, this bolstering the raft of measures it already includes, to further protect pets.

The new offensive will now consider the emotional stress caused to both owner and pets and will help to hand down more targeted penalties and sentences for pet thieves. Judges are now able to sentence pet thieves to up to 5 years in prison.

On a different subject, that of picking up, it would be very much appreciated if residents and visitors to Jordans would pick up their dog's slippery gifts. Recently the Village Green has had some very unpleasant deposits on the outer edges. Chalky Field and the lower field, where the new trees have been planted, both have visible deposits of poop lying in the grass. So please show some respect for our environment, village, and community, and bag it and bin it!
