

Jordans Village Fair

Saturday 13th June 2015

An earthly and entirely non-religious miracle occurs annually in June in Jordans - whatever the weather - on the morning of Jordans Village Fair, the clouds part and the sunshine smiles down on the proceedings, or at least tries to. This year was no exception, which must have been a huge relief to Pat Holdsworth and the rest of the Tenant Members' Committee who organise it.

The money raised goes to raise funds to maintain or improve village amenities and to carry out other activities, such as Sports Day, a jazz picnic, and carols on Christmas Eve.

This happy occasion started with a display of country dancing by pupils of Jordans School. After that, for both the young and the rest of us, we had: petting the sheep and goats; bowling for bacon (won in the under 12s by Barney with the formidable score of 70); a Silent Auction; Graham's amazing bric-a-brac stall - a positive Aladdin's Cave; for the very young hooking the ducks; a steam engine ride; mini golf; the

'Mel along with her husband Kevin came to live in Jordans in 1954 and was to live in the same house for

coconut shy (how *do* you make a coconut shy?); the obedient dog contest; the tea and hamburger tents; a tug of war for children, then one for adults (the latter won by Jordans-hurrah!- but they did have Andy Grant as their anchor); milk shakes in support of Help for Heroes; and on display were the original minutes of the concept of Jordans Village dated April 1916, nearly three years before the first brick was laid in February 1919.

In very old age it was people who meant the most to Mel - and we all


