

So please get yourselves, your families and friends sorted with all you could need for a great day out and head for the Village Green on Friday.





Welcoming our new arrivals from Ukraine

Source: An update from Martin Tett, Leader of the Buckinghamshire Council – May 12th 2022.

Very soon after the Ukraine crisis broke, the Government Homes for Ukraine scheme was launched. In response, Buckinghamshire Council decided to appoint a full time Liaison Officer to **Better Connected Beaconsfield (BCB)** and to allocate to BCB the responsibility for support for the Ukrainian refugees, who were coming to Beaconsfield and the prospective resident hosts.

BCB had started in 2018 as a small working group of people, largely church based, who had identified there was a serious problem of loneliness and isolation throughout the area. It sought volunteers from residents in the area to help mitigate the problem and was inundated with the response. It organised the volunteers into teams, pulled in individuals with relevant expertise and with the assistance of Anita Cranmer, the elected member for Beaconsfield for Buckinghamshire Council set itself up as a charity. It was backed by Buckinghamshire Council and currently has Anita as Chair.

"Currently she is Cabinet member for Education for Bucks and oversees 242 schools she also sits on the Executive of the new Unitary Authority. Her professional background is in teaching and she taught at Wycombe High before entering politics.

Anita gets things done. As Chair of the local Area Forum she promoted the Community Bus and the setting up of a new Charity (BCB) to ease isolation. She has fulfilled countless requests for help from residents and fixed problems and eased situations. You can be assured that she always listens and delivers wherever possible."

BCB is largely based at St Thomas's Church in Holtspur and the Reverend Michael Johnson is also a trustee. St Thomas's Church, in its effort – very successfully – to be part of the community, has made part of the Church into the very attractive and welcoming Dove Café so that residents can drop in throughout the week for tea, coffee and cake and a chat. Michael, is the Main Support Lead in the Charity, with his Ukrainian wife Yulia, as the essential and invaluable interpreter for our Ukrainian guests.




Set up from 12pm on Saturday and clear up by 12pm on Sunday.

Dorothy Morris

Dorothy (1924-2022) died peacefully at her home in Jordans on Good Friday. She and her husband, Ron, moved to the village in 1970 and lived in the same home, Orchard End, on Jordans Way for over fifty years.

Dorothy was born in Coventry but spent the early years of her childhood in New Zealand where her family lived in a small town north of Wellington and then later in central Sydney, Australia. She retained strong memories of living in both countries. Her family returned to Coventry around 1930 and she was brought up there. During the war, she joined the Royal Observer Corps after leaving school and could remember vividly her work there, particularly during the nights when the City was in complete blackout.

Dorothy married Ron in 1950 and they had three sons, twins Tim and Pete and then Chris, within eighteen months. She was thereafter preoccupied with the demands of running the family and home. In the mid-1960s they moved from Coventry to London when Ron's work took him there and thence to Jordans where their house, Orchard End, was built for them. She and Ron soon came to love the village and although they spent periods away from Jordans, in Germany in the mid-1970s and later in Scotland, they always thought of the village as their home and looked forward to returning to it.

Dorothy loved company and was very sociable. She built a busy social life in and around Jordans and was for many years an active member of the Chalfont Fine Arts Society. She enjoyed entertaining at home and was an excellent cook and hostess, as her many friends remarked. Later, Orchard End became a wonderful place for her grandchildren to come and play in the large garden and on the village green.

She and Ron were keen walkers. Originally, they had taken up walking with friends from Coventry as a means of staying in touch. Subsequently they became enthusiastic members of the Jordans Strollers and enjoyed the monthly outings around the Chilterns. Dorothy's post-walk teas for the group became legendary.

Dorothy said that she felt fortunate to have lived a long and happy life close to family and friends. She died at nearly ninety eight years of age in the comfort and familiarity of her own home, five months after Ron. Both of them often said Jordans had been a wonderful place to live and how much the village and its community had meant to them.



Changes to Adult Social Care Support

In October 2023, there will be changes to how people receive and pay for Adult Social Care support. Two of the key changes will be:

- 1. People will not have to pay more than £86,000 for care costs over their lifetime.
- 2. Anyone with less than £100,000 in savings and assets may be able to access financial support to fund their care.

There is nothing for you to worry about and you do not have to do anything, however should you wish to understand more about these changes you can visit the <u>Government's Social Care Reform Page</u> for further information. <u>Frequently asked questions are also available</u>.

What is the council doing?

We are working with Ernst and Young (EY) and Social Care Institute for Excellence (SCIE) to develop a plan for these changes. As part of this we are wanting to hear from residents in Buckinghamshire who are engaging with Adult Social Care:

- a. funded by the council
- b. paying for their own care (self-funders)
- c. organising care on behalf of relatives / another person

We want to understand how the changes may affect all resident's experiences in the future and by shaping this together we can better prepare for the changes ahead.

What we are asking of you

We are keen to understand, listen to and learn from residents and their carers. We need to understand what your experiences are and identify, what currently works well and what could be better.


When will these sessions take place?

We will be holding engagement sessions throughout June 2022 and would like to invite you to take part in a one-to-one session, or a small group session (4-6 residents) to explore your current experience of social care. The sessions will last approximately 90 minutes and you will be given an option to either meet in person at a suitable location, or virtually via Microsoft Teams.

You do not have to have any prior knowledge of the changes as the discussions will be mainly focused on your current experience.
