
As with the Jubilee last year we plan to celebrate over the weekend of the Coronation.

Get ready for NO MOW MAY

Once again, we are supporting Plantlife's No Mow May annual campaign not to mow our lawns in May to benefit wildlife. The UK has lost nearly 97% of flower rich meadows since the 1970s and with them vital food, habitats and nurseries of pollinators like bees and butterflies, have also disappeared. Four fifths of the UK's butterfly species have declined either in numbers or geographical spread, or both, since the late 1970s. Richard Fox, lead scientist on the recent State of UK Butterflies report stated, "the only reason they don't live on our lawns is because we go out and mow them every week. In doing so, we literally chop up the caterpillars." https://apple.news/AsubpftJR72 dauQw4hKg

How can we garden in a more wildlife friendly way? Mow your lawn once before May to cut back the vigorous grasses which will out compete other plants in your lawn (although if you are lucky enough to have Spring flowers in your lawn, mow around those). You can choose not to mow some or all of your green space. Then leave it for a month and smaller plants will have a chance to flower. If you can continue to mow less throughout the summer – even better!

The Soiled Underpants Challenge

What is the easiest way to tell if you have healthy, fertile soil that is good for growing plants? Bury a pair of cotton pants 5cm deep in the soil, leave them for at least 8 weeks, then dig them up and see how much is left!

Bring your soiled pants to the Flower and Produce Show on 10th September and we will hang them on the Soiled Pants Line and judge whose pants have the most holes. Remember to label them with your name, where you buried them and how long they were buried for.





Our Living Village - Ah Yes, I Remember it Well

Few things are more evocative than the first-hand memories of the older residents of our villages. As part of the Our Living Village project we're collecting such memories, ready to post them on the community website www.ourlivingvillage.org.

Several residents have already contacted us from far and wide. Here are just a few examples.

Judith Taylor, in her wonderful memoir "Growing Up in Jordans", has written amusingly about the relationship between our two villages: "Growing up in Jordans we were allowed a remarkable degree of freedom. I used to be allowed to cycle, with the older ones, to Burnham Beeches and Cookham. There was a big outdoor swimming pool among the trees at Burnham Beeches, with little changing cubicles all around the edge, as well as the old hollow trees to climb. At Cookham

we would be out all day, hiring punts and seeing how near to the weir we could get. Then we would find a quiet spot to tie up, have a picnic and swim. We would also go up onto Hodgemoor, beyond Seer Green. Seer Green itself was avoided because of the fearsome reputation of the Seer Green boys! They would occasionally send possies and come rushing down into Crutches woodword would be passed around that they had been spotted. I think I kept well away and I don't know if there were actually any 'battles'."

Michael Rabiger was an evacuee who lived at The Poplars, 42 Chalfont Road from 1943 to 1952 (aged 4 – 13). He's now a world-famous documentary maker living in Chicago. He writes: "I grew up around people called Boddy, Bowler, Cyster, Child, and Payne; my teacher in the village hall kindergarten was Miss Fanny Worley. I saw a V1 fly over the church during WW2 and participated in the VE day victory celebration. I learned to ride my bike in the Cherry Orchard near the 1940s post office, and have many memories of growing up in the village."

Dr Digby L James, publisher of old books and minister of the Quinta Independent Evangelical Church, Weston Rhyn, Shropshire has written:

"I was born in the upstairs main bedroom at 14 Orchard Road in 1952 and lived there until 1966. The privet hedge was planted by my father and, I guess, other neighbours. The long rear garden went down to a barbed wire fence bordering a Manor Farm field/cherry orchard. Going under the barbed wire once I caught my cheek on a barb and still have the scar - though now covered by my beard!"

And **Peter Martin** wrote:

"My family moved out from Acton,W.3 in October 1950 when I was three and bought a bungalow, built in1924 (since demolished) and replaced at 38 Highlands Road. At that time Highlands Road was unmade as were Howard Road/Crescent and Gurnells Road. The latter was particularly prone to large puddles and mud - great fun as a child playing with friends!"
