Jordans Apple Juice




There are	still a few ticke	ts for sale	for the Sunday	Matinee	via the Village S	Shop. Tickets for

Margaret Breedon 1925-2016

It is with great sadness that I write to report the passing of Margaret Breedon, former headmistress of Jordans Village School, and a well known figure in our village.

Margaret was born in Bolsover, Derbyshire, where she attended the local school and Chesterfield High School. She qualified as a teacher in 1945 and was accepted by Liverpool Education Committee spending 5 years there in both Primary & Secondary schools.

In 1952, at the age of 27, she was appointed head mistress of Jordans Village School, where she taught until 1967, when she applied for and was appointed Head of Gravel Hill Primary School in Chalfont St Peter with over 400 pupils on the roll.

She remained there until 1980 when she was advised to take early retirement for health reasons. She remained dedicated to the children in her care, and continued to live in Jordans where she took an active part in village life, and in Holy Trinity Church, Seer Green, until she was well over

In Spring of 2013 she was diagnosed with Fibrosis Alveolitis which severely curtailed her activities and led to her death aged 91. Margaret taught so many people who grew up in Jordans and since her passing, many have recalled how she played such a huge role in their education.

Margaret never married, and had no children; she had two brothers, one - Peter - is deceased, the other - Harry - still lives in Bolsover. Margaret has three nephews and two nieces, and many grand nephews/& nieces.

The funeral is for family only, and so a memorial event has been organised from 1 pm on Thursday 20th October and will be held in the Village Hall, and all who knew her are are invited to attend.

Bonfires - Best Neighbourly Practice

The Estate Office has received a number of calls recently in relation to bonfires, and a recent incident caused the Village School to have to bring the children in from the playground due to an enormous cloud of smoke engulfing them from a nearby bonfire, to which the fire brigade had to be called.

As a village we prefer that residents simply talk to their neighbours to make arrangements for a bonfire so as not to cause unnecessary annoyance, rather than setting rules. We thought it would be helpful to provide a list of simple Dos and Don'ts which might act as some kind of guide to the "Best Practice" for the setting of a Bonfire.

I might add that this years **Bonfire Night takes place on Saturday 5th November**, and residents (and only residents!) are invited to bring their inflammable garden waste up to the pyre at any time in the two weeks leading up to the event.

Do compost your garden waste; take garden to the Do your waste dump; Do save garden waste for the annual bonfire; your up neighbours well advance of having bonfire; Do warn your in Do instruct your gardening contractors to speak to neighbours before setting a fire; Don't hold a bonfire on a warm/fine day as neighbours are likely to have their windows open, be enjoying their gardens, and have washing hung out dry.


Jordans Quaker Meeting House
