3rd Chilterns Bike Ride - Sunday 15th October

With your great brand of support the shop's turnover has significantly improved since the all-time low in March, its survival is also due to fund raising and this month's event is The 3rd Chilterns Bike Ride on Sunday the 15th - less than 2 weeks away!

If bicycling is just not your thing please don't stop reading - your help is much-needed! Firstly in manning the check out/in 'desk' in the Village Hall where all the riders arrive in the morning, take copies of their chosen routes, and return to when they finish. Gaps at the moment are from 8.30 am until 10 am (2 volunteers please) and after 2 pm until all are back and refreshed! Help with clearing/washing up would also be appreciated. A significant feature in the Chilterns bike ride is the refreshments, and I would be so pleased for contributions of nutritious high carbohydrate goodies such as flap jacks to give the cyclists energy as they depart on their chosen routes. On return, yummy cakes, scones, and biscuits are of course the order of the day, so cooks: you don't have to be an expert! - get baking please. Anything would be very much appreciated. Thank you.

Now to the serious business of bicycling! As in previous years there is a fairly flat (nowhere is completely flat in The Chilterns!) route for relative beginners, children, and those perhaps coming back from an injury of some sort. This is a new route for 2017.

See you on Sunday the 15th, if not in the hall, somewhere out on the ride!



Amazing scrapbooks of Jordans History on long-term loan to Jordans Village Archive

We were delighted to receive three amazing scrap books of Jordans History on long-term loan from John & Sue Smithson of the Meeting House. The books were compiled by Leila Sparkes, whose husband Malcolm was a Conscientious Objector and imprisoned for this stance during the First World War. Both were closely involved in the creation of the Village.


We will publish various articles and images in the coming months, and begin with this amazing layout map of Jordans. The map shows that our Village might well have been called

the "Dean Farm Estate", with shops on either side of the Green, and an inn at the North end; a terrace where Christow Cottage is now located with another opposite; both Puers Lane and Green North Road could well have been connected to Jordans Lane too.

The Map below was published on 21st February 1919, in the local Gazette, who were reporting the news that "The First Cottages Begun". The layout of terraces is now a little closer to reality, but shops and workshops are still shown on both sides of the Green; the inn at the North end of the Green now has a School next to it in the North East corner, and Puers Lane is still shown as being connected to Jordans Lane. The Plots along Longbottom were of 1 acre, Copse Lane 3/4 acre, and Cottage sites on Puers Lane at half an acre.

What we now know as "Old Jordans" was once the Jordans Hostel, but before that it was known as Russell Farm. It was bought by Thomas Russell in 1618 from Sir Edward and Sir George Fleetwood of The Vache in Chalfont St. Giles, and a transcript of the original lease is included in the Leila Sparkes Collection. The eminent Quaker William Russell succeeded Thomas and is buried here in Jordans near to the grave of William Penn. The image above shows Old Jordans from the rear, with the old Refectory in centre shot and the Mayflower Barn slightly obscured by trees on the left. The Meeting House was known as New Jordans when it was built in 1688.

Jordans Picture House Shortlisted for "Best New Film Society" in the Film Society of the Year awards

We are delighted to announce that Jordans Picture House has been short-listed by Cinema for All in the Category Best New Film Society in the Film Society of the Year Awards. There are just 4 other contenders. The Awards Ceremony will take place in Sheffield on Saturday November 11th.

September Review

Our second season opened on Friday September 8th with the classic film "The Day of the Jackal" introduced by the author of the book, Freddy Forsyth who had just recently moved into the Village. Freddy regaled the audience with a string of reminiscences about how, flat broke, he sat down, determined to make some money and wrote the book in 7 weeks. However, it took 18 months before he could get a publisher to print a small run and, as he freely admitted, the lead up to the decision to make the film was down to an incredible sequence of good luck. It was however the film which launched his career as a best seller writer with a happy knack of the books also making outstanding films.

Jordans Picture House was packed out and the audience appreciated the wit and wisdom of Freddy and the transformation of the Hall to an art deco cinema with ceiling drapes, banners and red carpets. ("Thank you for transforming the Hall into the Ritz.") was one of the comments from a feedback form) A stunning evening.

On Sunday 10th we screened "The Eagle Huntress" and the film lived up to its billing;

Effectively stirring and bolstered by thrilling visuals, uses its heartwarming message to fill up a feature that might have made for an even more powerful short film

A couple of comments from the feedback forms:-

"Brilliant film. We can't find fault with any of the experience. Well done for all your effort."
"I am so pleased to have seen this film. Thank you."

October

The October film "Lion" was the film that received the most votes from the JPH August short list. This, like "The Day of the Jackal," sold out very quickly. We are confident of another memorable evening.



November

In November we are showing two outstanding films from the United States:- "Hidden Figures" and "I Am Not Your Negro." Originally we were planning to screen "13th" but we have been unable to secure a licence for public screening from Netflix.

"Hidden Figures" needs little introduction. Since its release it has received extensive media coverage and has been screened in thousands of cinemas all over the world (Gross Box Office Revenue \$169M). Our Ticket sales have been strong and there is little doubt that it will be another sell-out. It deals in a positive way with the fact that eventually the outstanding intellectual talent and ability of a few female African American mathematicians was recognised and harnessed crucially and successfully to the NASA programme.

"I Am Not Your Negro," has also been nominated for an Oscar and has received a fair degree of media coverage but, in contrast, as a documentary, always a major handicap, has not had anything like the number of screenings of "Hidden Figures". (Gross Box Office Revenue \$7M) There will be very few of you in this village who have seen this film. It deserves to be seen. We make no apologies – it is not entertainment. It is deeply challenging.

James Baldwin (1924-1987) was an inspirational African American commentator, writer and campaigner for the equal treatment of the African American in the United States. During the 60's he was one of the most eloquent and articulate leaders of the civil rights campaign. His unfinished book "Remember this House" was to have been a personal account of the lives of three of his close friends Medgar Evers, an American civil rights activist from Mississippi who worked to overturn segregation at the University of Mississippi, Malcolm X, the founder of the Black Panther movement and Martin Luther King, a major global figure who resolutely pursued the non-violent route for social justice for the African American. All three were murdered and James Baldwin only managed to complete 30 pages of his book. Raoul Peck envisages what the finished book might have said and has written a compelling screenplay.

Samuel L. Jackson is an outstanding narrator. His calm, quiet, understated tones juxtapose the eloquence of James Baldwin with clips of all three of his friends and

comments from major contemporary figures with images of the brutal, physical repression of the African American population. The clips from the Black Lives Matter campaign force you to ask the question what progress has been made since the 60's and was the Obama presidency just a sideshow or a dream.

It was released this year and received outstanding ratings on Rotten Tomatoes.

Critics: 98% Audience Score: 83%

Other comments include:-

"It is a striking work of storytelling. By assembling the scattered images and historical clips suggested by Baldwin's writing, I Am Not Your Negro is a cinematic séance, and one of the best movies about the civil rights era ever made."

"A film of immense power."

Let us leave the final words on "I Am Not Your Negro" to James Baldwin:-

"Not everything that is faced can be changed, but nothing can be changed until it is faced."

December

The two December films "Their Finest" and "A Streetcat Named Bob" have been chosen because they will leave our audiences feeling happy and uplifted. To date ticket sales of these two have barely started but we expect a triumphant end to 2017.

Jordans Masterchef



Everyone had 2.5 hours to make a dessert or savoury dish. The boy's team made a courgette cake using buckwheat flour and stevia, a form of plant sugar. The girl's team made a savoury platter that consisted of vegan arancini balls, rainbow stir-fry served on a bed of lettuce leaves, mini pizza bites (bases made of chickpea flour topped with olives, tomato sauce, rocket, raw garlic, raw onion, fried mushrooms and basil) and mushrooms stuffed with mashed potato and herbs.

Bonfire Night - Saturday 4th November We need your hedge trimmings!

The annual Jordans Bonfire Night is fast approaching, so now is the time to dust the shears off and trim your hedges as the trimmings can be saved up and added to the pyre.

If you are planning your own bonfire night and fireworks please consider your neighbours and their pets, and follow these guidelines:

- Please give your neighbours plenty of notice
- Leave the clippings to dry under a loose cover for a couple of weeks beforehand
- DO NOT burn any oily rags, rubber, damp garden waste which will give off heavy smoke or toxic fumes
- Make sure that pets are safely shut indoors
- Never light a bonfire when your neighbours have washing out on the line drying
- Burn material in small quantities so that the minimum amount of smoke is created
- Choose the site for your bonfire carefully, well away from trees, fences, and windows.

- Beware of bonfires on a windy day and take into account the direction of the wind.
- Never leave your bonfire unattended, and never leave it to smoulder for long periods - hose it down with cold water when you are finished.
- The ashes when cold, can be raked into your soil as a useful fertiliser.
- You must not set off fireworks between 11pm and 7am, except for:
 - Bonfire Night, when the cut off is midnight
 - New Year's Eve, Diwali and Chinese New Year, when the cut off is 1am
- You can be fined up to £5,000 and imprisoned for up to 6 months for selling or using fireworks illegally. You could also get an on-the-spot fine of £90.


