



Bournville Village Trust

Estate Manager Chris Jenkins paid a visit to Bournville in South West Birmingham to meet Peter Roach, the CEO of Bournville Village Trust, effectively Jordans Village Ltd's "big brother". He writes:

George Cadbury was greatly influenced by his Quaker beliefs, and held a deep seated social concern for the way people were forced to live in the overcrowded back streets of Birmingham. Conditions were so poor that healthy living was almost impossible and at the end of the 19th Century life expectancy was about 40 years.

chocolate business, moving from Birmingham City Centre to its present site (which was then in the country) in 1879. The area around the new 'factory in a garden' was named Bournville. Bourn was the name of the local stream, and 'ville' was apt because of the French rivalry in chocolate-making at the time.

George Cadbury is a founding shareholder of Jordans Village, as our Minutes of the Management Committee dated 15th November 1921 record his purchase of the maximum amount, £200 worth, at his request to be held in his sister's name - Elizabeth Mary Cadbury.

The purpose of my trip was to build relationships with BVT, as they manage 8,000 properties and count 25,000 residents in the various districts around Bournville, and clearly have a lot of useful experience. BVT employs its maintenance and horticultural staff directly, with over 300 employees in total - they are rather bigger than Jordans!

While I was there I took the time to capture images of the different styles of architecture I found around the estate, and met with the current Director of BVT <u>Architects division</u>, Ian Tipton. I presented him with a copy of the Layout Plan of Jordans Village you see at the top of this

The Plan was drawn up by S. Alex Wilmot of Bournville Architects in 1928, and Ian was fascinated to discover just how closely linked our villages are, such that he came down to visit us in Jordans in the last week of August to see examples of the architecture designed by Fred Rowntree for himself.

BVT has a long history of sustainable building, having pioneered "Sunshine Homes" in the 1930s, that were 45% more efficient than the typical building of the day thanks to careful positioning and window sizing to the north and south sides, and in the early 1980's BVT developed a solar village at Rowheath that used some of the earliest solar installations to provide 34% of all heat in the house.

Built in 1899 as part of the suite of offices for the directors of the then newly formed Cadbury Brothers Limited Company, No. 1 Lodge is now the main entrance to the factory. George and Richard Cadbury began the business as a partnership; their original offices, built in 1880, are located just behind No. 1.



Jordans Village Hall is available for hire and holds regular events.


