





# **QUIETER GARDENS PLEASE!**

At 8:00 am the other morning, when the contract gardeners started work, the operators were gunning the engines, just like a Formula 1 racing driver on the starting grid. In Jordans, if it is just one leaf-blower you are relatively lucky. There is a good chance that that you will also have a couple of hedge cutters on the go and possibly a lawn mower. And that is from just one garden. For those of us who are retired people - and there are quite few – the noise can assault our ears from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Cordless battery driven machines are the route to dramatic noise reductions. The battery life on the household versions, available in the DIY chains is inadequate. However the major manufacturers produce ranges of garden tools for professional gardeners in noise sensitive environments, such as hospitals, schools, cemeteries and public parks.

These are only available from specialist suppliers for the trade (professional gardeners/ground maintenance specialists). The nearest to Jordans/Seer Green is George Browns in Chesham. Web-site <a href="https://www.georgebrowns.co.uk">www.georgebrowns.co.uk</a>.

The kit the professionals are now starting to buy in increasing numbers is the Stihl AP300

battery at £187 and the Stihl charger AL500 which costs another £108 but will do a full charge in 25 minutes. This battery is interchangeable between tools so the cost is spread. The cost of the battery can be recouped very easily as the price of battery driven tools are half the price of their petrol driven equivalents.

With hedge cutting, you would expect to get 3 hours life from the battery before you need a recharge. You can do the recharge while you are picking up the hedge cuttings - or having a short break.

The noise from petrol driven tools requires operators wear ear protectors which are hot and uncomfortable. Battery driven tools are significantly quieter, with much less vibration, lighter and easier to operate. For your own comfort and out of consideration for your neighbours use battery driven tools yourself and persuade your contract gardener to switch if he/she is not using them already.

PS on Leaf Blowers: In the late 1990s one Los Angeles grandmother, Diane Wolfberg, took on Los Angeles Council's parks and gardens department to demonstrate that a rake and broom could be as quick as a leaf blower, do a neater job and, of course do it all much more quietly. Over three different tests Wolfberg remained unbeaten against a muscular gardener hefting a petrol blower.

So give them a rake and broom!


