It's been 18 months since our last JQ and many of you have said how much you miss it. Well, it's back! Same place in the Jordans Village Hall, still the first Friday of every month (except August)!

Jolly Quaker founder Chris Waymouth will now be found enjoying a well-deserved pint with you all, and new "landlords", Francesca and Paul, will be taking over day-to-day JQ management. And there are a few other changes we'd like to highlight:

- Slightly different **start time** - it's **7.30 pm** instead of 7!
- We're **cashless!** So, please **bring your contactless payment card.**
- **Seating** will be **inside and out** (weather permitting). We will have open windows, outside tables and vaccinated staff to make our event as safe as possible. Our COVID guidelines are below.

COVID Guidelines

Village Hall

- All surfaces will be cleaned prior to the commencement of the event.
- Anti-bacterial hand cleanser will be available at the door and at the bar.
- We will be keeping windows open to encourage ventilation.
- Service will be at the bar - there will be no table service.

- There will also be table(s) available outside (depending on weather).
- For the avoidance of doubt, we will not be checking vaccination status or Covid 19 test results.
- An NHS check in poster will be displayed. If you do not have the NHS app, you are welcome to leave your contact details at the door.

Staff

- All staff are expected to be fully vaccinated OR have evidence of a recent negative COVID-19 test. This is to protect both staff and customers.
- You are welcome to wear a mask whilst volunteering but it is not mandatory.
- Please wash your hands regularly during the evening.
- Please encourage customers to respect social distancing.
- Please encourage customers not to touch the bar surfaces.

- If you are showing COVID-19 symptoms please do not attend.
- We would recommend that all customers take a lateral flow test (order online) before visiting.

- Feel free to check in using the NHS app scan at the door.

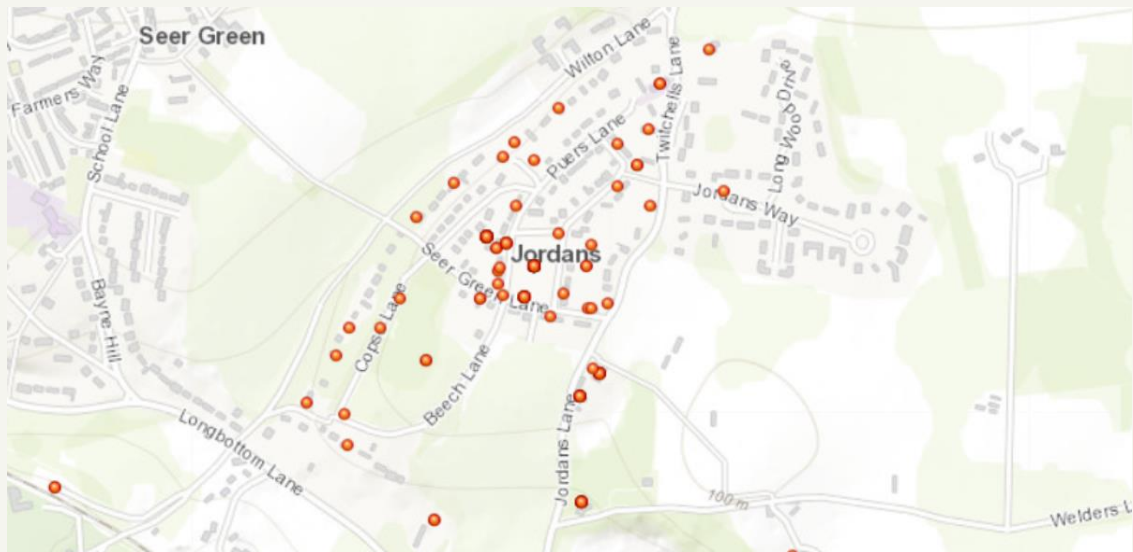

Our Living Village – Roll Up, Roll Up for the Great Reveal

After two years of effort by many residents across our two communities we're finally in a position to demonstrate the achievements of the *Our Living Village* project, giving you the opportunity to review this collective memory of Seer Green and Jordans and to learn how you can access and add to it in the future.

We're organising two public meetings as part of the Chiltern Society's Heritage Festival, as follows:

- **Saturday 25th September at the Jordans Village Hall starting at 2.00pm**
- **Saturday 2nd October at the Seer Green Baptist Church starting at 2.00pm**

We appreciate that many people will not have participated in a public event for well over a year so we're doing everything necessary to ensure that you feel safe and Covid secure at these meetings.

We'll be covering the following topics at these meetings:

- The nature and the aims of the *Our Living Village* project.
- A review of the many community themes that have been researched by the project, including the development of religion, education, pubs, local trade and industry, music literature and art, and important historical buildings. All of these themes will be illustrated against an extensive collection of local maps that we've collected and digitised as part of this initiative.
- Instruction on how you can consult and contribute to this community history online.
- Discussion over tea, followed by an optional walk around the village to view a few of the important local sites.

Each of the events will cover the history of both of our two communities, so if you can't get to the one taking place in your village then please do come to the other one.

News from Jordans Village Limited **Climate Action Plan Statement**

Climate change is one of the most significant issues facing the world today. The effects are being felt already. Met. Office data shows that since 1884 all the UK's ten warmest years have occurred since 2002. In a special report of the Inter-Governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the United Nations highlights the need to take immediate action to limit the increase in average global temperatures to a 1.5°C threshold. Even an increase of half a degree beyond this will drastically worsen the risk of drought, floods, extreme heat, and poverty.

The challenge of climate change is a global issue, and everyone needs to play their part. JVL agrees that:

- Climate change presents a threat to our way of life
- We recognise the need to act in line with UK laws to bring all greenhouse gas emissions to net zero by 2050 which will help limit a global average temperature increase to 1.5°C, (<https://www.gov.uk/government/news/uk-becomes-first-major-economy-to-pass-net-zero-emissions-law>)
- JVL must play its part by showing leadership on this issue

It may initially seem that JVL can do very little compared to larger community organisations but in fact there are many opportunities for us to run our affairs more sustainably, put climate action at the heart of our decision making, and inspire residents to make their own changes.

JVL has already taken the first steps to reduce energy wastage and carbon emissions from its properties by installing three solar panel arrays and improving insulation in most of its properties. It is planning further improvements that will ensure its properties all have an Energy Performance rating of C or better by 2028 and will search for solutions for electric car charging and the replacement of gas-fired boilers.

We intend to work with residents, businesses, and community groups to support Jordans in reducing carbon emissions, energy usage, and waste.

TODDLERS IN THE WOODS

I'm so excited to announce the start of a brand new venture in our village!

Day and Time - Every Friday during term time from 9.15am until 10.15am, starting on Friday 10th September.

Venue - The Centenary Clearing in Crutches Wood

Cost - £2.50 per child per session (accompanying babies free) payable in cash on arrival. No booking necessary - just turn up!

All pre-school children accompanied by a parent/carer are very welcome

What is it all about?

Innately very young children have a natural curiosity about the natural world and sadly it is our hurried lives that stop the development of this and propel our young into the indoor world of bought toys. These, however much educational value they may have, are a far cry from what can be learnt and enjoyed outdoors and especially in a woodland setting.

Getting outside, discovering the wonders of the natural world leads to so much including acquiring a responsibility for the world that we live in, something that indoor toys cannot do.

For parents, grandparents and daily minders of these children, allowing time to watch and with growing confidence, help the children explore and develop their natural creativity using materials found in the woods can be an eye opener.

Young children's need for physical activity will be encouraged and using for example sawn logs and sturdy branches, there will be activities to develop their balance and confidence in their own ability.

Of course there will also be areas simply to play in with twigs, leaves and even dare I say heavy duty plastic dumper trucks and trailers to fill.

Bug watching will not be left out - a firm favourite for toddlers.

Sharing, learning to take turns, and consideration for their peers will be paramount and through these practices, even at a very young age, friendships will be formed that could well continue through their young lives and even beyond.

We will get to know one another whether younger or older through play and singing simple songs which young children love and are so often lost in the hustle and bustle of family life.

How we have all got used to being outside in inclement weather during the pandemic and as the cooler temperatures approach we will dress ourselves, as well as our children, appropriately to keep warm and dry.

TODDLERS IN THE WOODS will be open to anyone at any time - there is no need to sign up. At the outset there will be a registration form explaining that each adult bringing a child and child minders bringing more than 1 child is responsible for the safety and well being of the children in their care.

There will be a small charge of £2.50 per walking child payable in cash each week at The Centenary Clearing to cover incidental expenses. Perhaps in time we might move on to fund raising for some storage facilities in the woods or even a compostable toilet. Both these Jordans Village Ltd are happy to consider.

TODDLERS IN THE WOODS will take place every Friday morning during term time with the start date being FRIDAY 10th SEPTEMBER. Each session will last an hour and will run from 9.15 -10.15. All coming are welcome to arrive early or stay on in the woods afterwards. The start of each session will be signalled with a welcome song. All pre-toddlers are welcome too if in a carrier/buggy/or closely supervised by the responsible adult if on the move.

How I look forward to the start of a toddler group - **TODDLERS IN THE WOODS** in Jordans and we welcome all from Seer Green and surrounding areas as well as those living in our village.

The Swarthmore Lecture 2021

Anyone attending a Quaker meeting for the first time will find that there is no planned service, no music and no sermon. However, once a year, even since 1907, there has been a Swarthmore Lecture where a Friend is asked to prepare a major piece of research and deliver it in an annual lecture. The Swarthmore Lecture has a two-fold purpose: firstly, to interpret further to the

members of the Society of Friends their Message and Mission; and, secondly, to bring before the public the spirit, the aims and the fundamental principles of the Friends.

This year's Swarthmore Lecture by Thomas Penny is entitled Kinder Ground Creating Space for Truth. Penny, a journalist, talked about how different versions of the truth can be reported about the same incident. He used as an example of discerning the truth the shooting of the terrorist Khalid Masood in 2017 on Westminster Bridge which he witnessed. Penny saw the whole incident from his office window above the bridge and was interrogated intensively by the police to ascertain the facts. There were other examples which Penny mentioned, including the Troubles in Northern Ireland, where he had found that discerning the truth about what actually happened proved difficult. He encouraged us to be sceptical about news reporting and realise that the reporting can be influenced by the point of view of who owns the newspaper; but he also encouraged us to try to understand the point of view of those we did not agree with because there might be some truth in their view. He suggested that this might be done on 'kinder ground' implying an intention to view the Other more kindly, despite their views that conflict with ours.
