Welcome to the August edition of your community newsletter!

After such a damp start to the year we were happy to have a beautiful sunny day for our annual cricket match, which proved to be another really enjoyable day. Thanks for everyone who came along to watch, and of course play in the match which is an important tradition of the village.

In August we are welcoming a new farmer to take over grazing our fields - Jonathan Chapman of Native Beef. He is an organic farmer with over 300 head of cattle and 300 sheep based at his farms in Chalfont St Giles and Sarratt. His approach is to have a content, healthy herd of cattle; to produce the best beef; and to enhance the environment that he farms. He intends to graze a small herd of native breed cattle on our fields, and harvest the grass for hay as necessary. His family has

Jordans Cricket Match 28th July 2024 The annual tradition of a Cricket Match on Jordans Village Green continued this year on a sunny Sunday afternoon. Free Scythe Training Saturday 31st August - New Date!

The Chiltern Society are offering free training on how to use a scythe! We're not currently planning to scythe Manor Farm Field North but you might want to use this technique to maintain the wild patches in your own garden or take part in volunteer scything events locally.

The training will teach you how to set up and use modern alpine scythes including all aspects of scythe safety and maintenance. Training typically lasts 5 hours including a lunch break, with trainees having an opportunity to use scythes in the field and to practise sharpening techniques for peening and honing blades.

No previous scythe experience is required, though a reasonable level of physical fitness is desirable.



George Fox 400-a concert in Words and Music

On Sunday afternoon 7 July around 45 of us were treated to a historical musical feast in the Jordans Quaker Meeting House: "George Fox 400-a concert in words and music" commemorated the 400th anniversary of the birth of George Fox, the founder of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers).

The programme consisted of Martin Pounce and Catriona Troth, dressed in 17th century Quaker garb, recounting the life and contributions to Quakerism of George Fox and alternating with music performed by a trio of Jane Faulkner, a professional violinist and member of the Jordans Meeting, Esther Cavett (keyboard), whose grandparents and father are buried in the Jordans Meeting House Burial Ground and Richard Simpson (oboe), former principal oboe in the Halle Orchestra

and subsequently principal oboe in the BBC Symphony Orchestra.

The twelve pieces of music were selected to highlight the trio of oboe, violin and keyboard. There were also two oboe solos by Richard Simpson: 'Pan' by Benjamin Britten and 'Concerto for oboe by Albinoni. Howard Skempton's 'Lull and Little Barcarolle' played by Esther was moving in its simplicity.

Many thanks to Jane and Esther for arranging and performing the musical programme and also to Martin Pounce and Catriona Troth for their dramatic narration of George Fox's life. And we were very fortunate in having Richard Simpson contribute so much to this special concert.
