

Free Scythe Training Saturday 24th or Sunday 25th August

(they will choose the day most people can do)

The Chiltern Society are offering free training on how to use a scythe! We're not currently planning to scythe Manor Farm Field North but you might want to use this technique to maintain the wild patches in your own garden or take part in volunteer scything events locally.

The training will teach you how to set up and use modern alpine scythes including all aspects of scythe safety and maintenance. Training typically lasts 5 hours including a lunch break, with trainees having an opportunity to use scythes in the field and to practise sharpening techniques for peening and honing blades.

No previous scythe experience is required, though a reasonable level of physical fitness is desirable.

CBA Festival comes to Seer Green & Jordans

The Council for British Archaeology (CBA) holds an annual nationwide public Festival of Archaeology in July each year. This year the theme is Archaeology & Community. Search the event listing at www.archaeologyuk.org/festival/festival-event-listing.html for activities near to wherever you find yourself this summer.

As a community-based heritage project, Our Living Village has partnered with the Buckinghamshire Archaeology Society (BAS) to offer our popular local heritage walks as part of this year's Festival. This is a fitting tribute and response to the Our Living Village project having won the BAS Archaeology prize last year.

These guided walks will follow similar itineraries to those on the ourlivingvillage.org website, which are now also available through the Love Exploring app.

Booking is required as the number of attendees is restricted. However, the walks are open to the public and are bookable either from the Festival website (address above), or directly with Buckinghamshire Archaeological Society at www.bast.org.uk/bas-outings-july-2024. There is a small charge for non-BAS members. Walks will take place in Seer Green on 20th July, Jordans on 27th July, and around Hodgemoor Woods on 21st July.


