## Jordans Biodiversity Project

#### Ever fancied laying a hedge?

#### Hedgelaying course - Saturday 5th October

We are planning to lay one of the overgrown hedges on the boundary of Manor Farm Field. Hedgelaying is a process of partially cutting through then bending the stems of shrubs and small trees to encourage them to produce new growth from the base. The result is a thicker, stock proof hedge that creates an ideal habitat for a variety of wildlife.

The training day will take place on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October and then, with expert guidance, we will lay our hedge over a number of days in the Autumn/Winter. If you are interested in learning this skill and then using it to help us to lay a hedge (you don't have to commit to every date), then do be in touch and we'll send more details.

#### Next Volunteer Event - Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 10am - 1pm

Last month a mighty band of 16 volunteers helped to clear the base of the hedge ready for laying. It was satisfying work but we didn't quite finish it. So please join us on 22<sup>nd</sup> September to finish the job. Long sleeves and tough gloves advised but do let us know if you are planning to come so we can make sure there's enough cake!

#### Other news from Manor Farm Field

- We held the first Jordans Biodiversity Day on 3<sup>rd</sup> August which included an early morning bird safari, a visit to the wildflower meadow at Newbarn Farm in Seer Green and a bat survey at dusk. With the help of the Chiltern Rangers, we also ran some wildlife themed craft activities on the field. The safaris in particular were well attended and there was much interest in our wildflower seed infused clay tiles and bird boxes. A highlight was the 9 species of bat that were recorded between MFF and the Village Green! We'll do it again next year if you missed out!
- We are adding regular bat surveys and reptile monitoring to our monthly butterfly surveys.
   The season for wildlife monitoring closes soon but be in touch if you are interested in taking part next year.
- We have a smart new gate as does the south field!
- The next phase of our management plan will begin: you'll notice some new fencing going in and part of the grassland being rotavated ready for autumn sowing of wildflower seeds. We might need some help sowing the seeds, so keep a look out on WhatsApp or be in touch.

Manor Farm Field North is managed by Jordans Biodiversity Group to promote the variety of life that might naturally be found in grassland in the Chilterns. The field is located on the footpath between Jordans and Seer Green, on the north side of the hedgerow along the narrow section just up from Wilton Lane.



## Our Living Village

#### CBA Festival of Archaeology walks in Seer Green & Jordans

This year's Council for British Archaeology (CBA) public Festival of Archaeology included a series of walks based on the Seer Green & Jordans Our Living Village heritage walks. These walks were delivered with the support of the Buckinghamshire Archaeological Society (BAS). This was fitting as the festival theme for 2024 was Archaeology and Community, and the Our Living Village project was the winner of the 2023 BAS Archaeology Award for its contribution to community-based heritage research.

One walk was delivered in Jordans, two in Seer Green, and two in Hodgemoor Woods. Numbers were limited to 20 for each walk, with a total of about 85 people attending across the events.

In Seer Green the walk covered 1000 years of the historical development of a typical Chilterns village, from Anglo-Saxon farmstead through to the coming of the railway in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. In the ancient woodland of Hodgemoor Woods we looked at the landscape archaeology and its relationship with the geology, walking through 2000 years of history from a Romano-British farmstead and Roman Road, through to World War II occupation and post-War resettlement camp. In Jordans we focussed on the emergence of the Quakers in the 17<sup>th</sup> century and included a hosted visit to the Friends Meeting House, and how arrival of the railway enabled this to became the focal point for an early 20<sup>th</sup> century experiment with the creation of a model village.

Thanks to BAS for their support in making these walks so successful, and to Nina Liebenberg for hosting the visit to Jordans Meeting House.

These guided walks followed similar itineraries to those on the <u>www.ourlivingvillage.org</u> website, which are also available through the Love Exploring app.
